Dunedin Report – Lynn Taylor

Our cohort down south is small, so for now we'll continue with putting a spotlight on members. Introducing Marion Mertens from Dunedin. I was thrilled to be invited to Marion's home, which contains 3 studios that she switches between. A paper conservation studio (her previous profession), textiles hook rug studio (including - swoon - a bookcase of exquisitely dyed blankets) and a print studio complete with one of Jack Thompson's presses. Tools, brushes, sketchbooks and works in progress are aesthetically arranged and invite creativity.

There is a noticeable theme of marine life in Marion's work, I even mistook a set of photographs for enlarged microscopic slides. I presumed Marion came from a science background but rather, her art is influenced from previously living in Kaitaia, snorkelling and swimming in the sea that she lived near. This combines with a fascination for life you can't see with the naked eye, things beyond the radar. An awareness of microscopic worlds is something, which began in childhood from her father's profession as a pathologist. She describes her marine "critters" as "made up but believable." They certainly are and it's a delight to see the pop-up book pages she is collating, using printed, cut out paper creatures. Sociable Housing (WIP) began with a photograph of a shell and barnacles, which she worked up into drawings and woodblock to express different critters living on the same planet. As well as reduction cutting Marion cut out the key shapes of the woodblocks with a coping saw so parts could be printed flexibly and possibly in combination with other plates. Marion doesn't create a colour palette before printing but responds to what is happened on the press. The repetition of printing an edition didn't appeal so after printing base layers she became "reckless, drawing into the prints with water-soluble pencils and gouache which allowed to make them more dramatic, express different feelings and different times of day and night."

Updated "130 Celebrate 130" FKA "125 CELEBRATE 125" - 130 NZ ARTISTS' BOXED PRINT CELEBRATION COLLECTION

THIS PROJECT IS ORGANISED BY <u>THE FRANKLIN PRINT GROUP</u> (Vicky Moore-Allen, Esther Hansen, Jude Gordon, Bridget Burnett, Sue Colmer, Meg Wilson, Joanna Fields, Rachel Schanzer and Elise Smith) • We seek 50 print makers (all genders) from throughout NZ to contribute two A4-paper prints to complete and update the "130 celebrate 130" project (formerly known as the 125 celebrate 125 project (we only reached 80 prints in 2018 but we want to complete the project and update it for the 2023 celebration of 130 years of NZ women's suffrage)). These 2 prints will be made into two carefully collated boxed sets, to be displayed and archived as part of the 130 Suffrage Exhibition in NZ at the Franklin Gallery in September 2023.

• Imagery may link to the past and/or present. Consider how to celebrate the lives, roles, presence or influence of women, whether inspired by history, our national story, or your personal experiences or thinking.

• The first box will be displayed in Pukekohe at the Franklin gallery and this boxed set will likely be toured and shown at other venues, currently being arranged. This boxed set will be gifted to the Auckland Museum, to be archived as part of their collection at the conclusion of exhibiting. The second box set will be gifted to the Christchurch art gallery. Prints will also be on shared on Facebook and Instagram.

• Printed imagery must be generated by a hand-made print process but may also include a digital elements.

• Print 2 of your edition onto white A4 sized Rosaspina paper. Prints must be black & white but may include one other colours of your choice if desired. Colour could be generated in the printing of the block(s), or via other means, such as chine colle, hand colouring, etc.

• Please format your print to leave a 2 cm frame of white paper

Post 2 prints to the address below by <u>26th May 2023</u>.

• Cost: \$10 entry fee to cover costs (boxes, linen, archival tissue, courier fees) to be sent with the prints. Artists must purchase own Rosaspina paper for their edition. We wish to keep paper formats consistent. Rosaspina is available from National Art Supplies.

• Artists may submit more than one edition. If we receive more than 130 prints, we will undertake a selection process. Unselected prints will be responsibly returned to the artist.

• Print sales: Determine the size of your edition yourself. You are welcome to sell prints via your own networks. Print sales will not be a part of this display, but artist names and contact details, websites will be publicised on social media, so that people interested in purchasing prints can contact the artists directly.
